Ethnicity, Diversity & Inclusion Update

I'm pleased to report that we will be launching our new ED&I policy shortly. Data on gender and ethnicity is still lacking for a proportion of our membership, and I would encourage everyone to fill this in, to help drive better understanding of the entirety of our membership. BIASP remains committed to promoting diverse career pathways within stroke medicine and will be launching a workforce survey in due course to understand the national picture in more detail. The website has also been updated to highlight different career pathways. As previously mentioned, we have recently appointed a new SAS doctor representative to the BIASP executive team, to further strengthen our ability to promote and support this important subgroup of stroke clinicians.

Trainee Subcommittee Update

The BIASP's Trainees' meeting ran between 14th and 15th March at Southall Complex in Edinburgh. 68 delegates attended the two-day meeting where 16 speakers delivered educational talks across the breadth of the stroke care pathway, covering hyperacute care through to complex rehabilitation.

We are immensely grateful to The Stroke Association for their support of the meeting, including contributing experiences of stroke survivors and how patient reported experience measures can drive improvements in stroke care.

Planning is already underway for the 2025 Trainees Meeting which will be hosted in the Republic of Ireland.

New Training Route for Stroke Consultants

There is now a new GIM-Stroke training pathway programme available which will take 3 years to CCT.

The stroke curriculum allows for training in GIM coupled to stroke. GIM acts as a specialty and successful applicants would CCT in GIM. Stroke is the sub-specialty. The training programme will last for three years with two years of GIM and one year of stroke. Unlike the usual stroke recruitment, applicants will not already have an NTN. They will be able to apply while completing IMT3. All applicants will have to have completed IM stage 1 or equivalent before they start. All applicants will have to have MRCP or equivalent by interview. On successful completion of training, trainees would have a CCT in GIM and a sub-specialty CCT in Stroke Medicine.

Further information on the GIM-Stroke 3-year CCT will be available in due course which BIASP will sign post to.

NEW 2023 National Clinical Guideline for Stroke

Updated National Clinical Guideline for Stroke now available

The 2023 edition of the National Clinical Guideline for Stroke for the UK and Ireland is now available. Over half the recommendations are new or have been updated. Big changes in the evidence base since the previous edition in 2016 have led to significant updates in three main areas:

- A big expansion of patients eligible for thrombolysis and thrombectomy
- More intensive interventions in secondary prevention – antiplatelets, cholesterol, blood pressure
- More intensive rehab in hospital and at home to promote motor and language recovery.

This is a 'five nations' guideline for the first time ever, covering all of the UK and the Republic of Ireland. The guideline is endorsed for use in clinical practice by the Royal College of Physicians (London), the Scottish Intercollegiate Guidelines Network (SIGN) and the Royal College of Physicians of Ireland.

The electronic Referral Service (e-RS) in England have had a number of users asking for Stroke Medicine Specialty with Stroke (not TIA) clinic type to be created in the e-RS system as this currently sits under the following two specialties:

This has been voted on, as a change that would help GPs find the service, help consultants find their own specialty and referral workflows.

NIHR update: changes ahead in 2024

In the 12 months since April 2023, more than 14,000 patients across the UK have participated in 114 Stroke studies listed on the NIHR Clinical Research Network (CRN) portfolio. This year there will be even more studies seeking evidence to improve prevention, acute care, rehabilitation and wellbeing, but there are also some important changes ahead in how the NIHR CRN is being organised to best support research across all of the 30 clinical specialties that it recognises, including Stroke.

Survey

Physician Questionnaire on Stroke Care for People Living with Dementia and/or Disability

The team at the University of Calgary, led by Dr. Aravind Ganesh, is conducting an online survey on approaches to stroke care for people living with dementia or disability. They would like to invite fellows and physicians in independent practice, involved in any aspects of acute stroke management and post-stroke rehabilitation, to take part.

The collected data will potentially be used to inform the design of a clinical trial to optimize acute stroke management for people living with dementia or disability.

Survey on the Global Status and Perceptions of Stroke Rehabilitation & Telerehabilitation

The survey was developed and validated by a team of stroke experts from the World Stroke Organization (WSO) Future Leaders Program to understand the role of telerehabilitation and identify areas of opportunities and improvements. Understanding the current landscape of stroke telerehabilitation will help address resource gaps and influence policy-making to enhance stroke care.

The survey comprises 6 brief questions on conventional rehabilitation and up to 27 brief questions on telerehabilitation. Your participation is crucial, and all responses will be anonymous. Expect the survey to take approximately 15-20 minutes to complete.

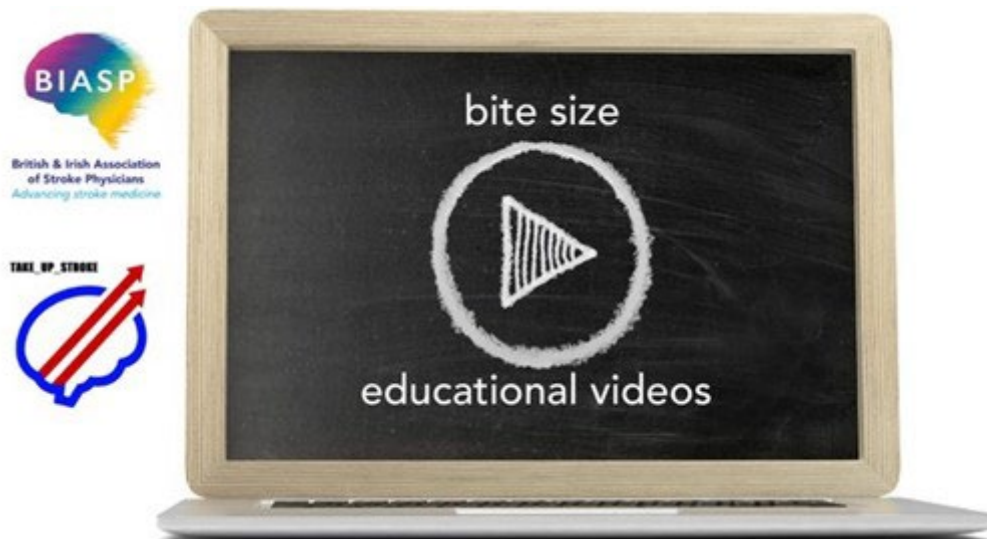
