As I write this bulletin entry, for those of us living in the UK, the general election results have just been announced and we have a new government.

Whatever our own political beliefs, I think we can all agree that we very much hope a new government will bring some changes for the better for our patients, some fresh ideas and energy, resolution of the junior doctors' strike, and something to boost the morale of a flagging workforce.

It was good to see the Stroke Association campaigning to Make Stroke A Priority with their manifesto on stroke for the next UK government, released in April. This contained 3 key asks:

1. A funded stroke prevention plan
2. Thrombectomy universally available 24/7

3. All stroke survivors access rehabilitation and Life After Stroke support in line with guidelines

If nothing changes, the Stroke Association estimate that in 10 years' time, stroke will cost the public purse £75 billion, nearly half the current NHS budget. Those of us longer in the tooth will recall how the National Audit Office stroke report in 2005 was a powerful force for change when it demonstrated that doing stroke care badly was not only bad for patient outcomes but also extremely expensive. On the back of that we had our original National Stroke Strategy in 2007 and so much progress made. Let's take this opportunity to engage our local politicians, many of whom are new in role, and ensure they are aware of the need to make stroke care a priority.

Politics aside, I would like to wish each and every one of you a wonderful summer including some sunshine and brightness, and new special memories made in beautiful places with those that you love. Have fun!

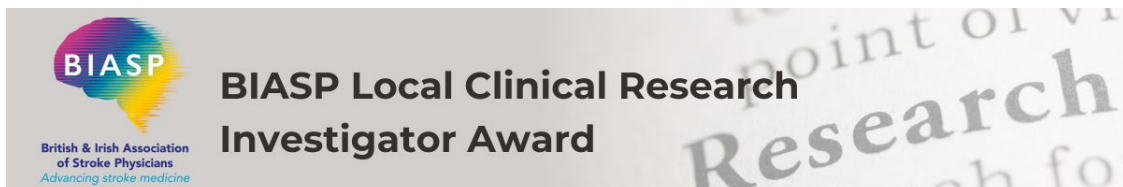

New Training Route for Stroke Consultants

There is now a new GIM-Stroke training pathway programme available which will take 3 years to CCT.

The stroke curriculum allows for training in GIM coupled to stroke. GIM acts as a specialty and successful applicants would CCT in GIM. Stroke is the sub-specialty. The training programme will last for three years with two years of GIM and one year of stroke. Unlike the usual stroke recruitment, applicants will not already have an NTN. They will be able to apply while completing IMT3. All applicants will have to have completed IM stage 1 or equivalent before they start. All applicants will have to have MRCP or equivalent by interview. On successful completion of training, trainees would have a CCT in GIM and a sub-specialty CCT in Stroke Medicine.

UK Health Alliance on Climate Change



UKHACC have coordinated the publication of an editorial in 200+ journals. This year the [editorial](#) calls for the climate and nature crisis to be recognised as one indivisible global health emergency.

A petition calling on WHO to declare a global public health emergency is being launched to coincide with the editorial.

It is the third in a series of annual multi-journal editorials published ahead of the UN Climate Conferences in 2026, 2027 and 2028 coordinated by the UK Health Alliance on Climate Change.

NEW 2023 National Clinical Guideline for Stroke

Updated National Clinical Guideline for Stroke now available

The 2023 edition of the National Clinical Guideline for Stroke for the UK and Ireland is now available. Over half the recommendations are new or have been updated. Big changes in the evidence base since the previous edition in 2016 have led to significant updates in three main areas:

- A big expansion of patients eligible for thrombolysis and thrombectomy
- More intensive interventions in secondary prevention – antiplatelets, cholesterol, blood pressure
- More intensive rehab in hospital and at home to promote motor and language recovery.

This is a 'five nations' guideline for the first time ever, covering all of the UK and the Republic of Ireland. The guideline is endorsed for use in clinical practice by the Royal College of Physicians (London), the Scottish Intercollegiate Guidelines Network (SIGN) and the Royal College of Physicians of Ireland.

Specialty Stroke Medicine in the electronic Referral Service (e-RS)

The electronic Referral Service (e-RS) in England have had a number of users asking for Stroke Medicine Specialty with Stroke (not TIA) clinic type to be created in the e-RS system as this currently sits under the following two specialties:

- Geriatric Medicine / Stroke (not TIA)
- Neurology / Stroke (not TIA)

This has been voted on, as a change that would help GPs find the service, help consultants find their own specialty and referral workflows.

Updated Lipid Pathway

The Accelerated Access Collaborative, overarching lipid pathway ([summary of national guidance for lipid management for primary and secondary prevention of cardiovascular disease \(CVD\)](#)) has been updated to take account of [NICE NG238](#) (December 2023, “Cardiovascular disease: risk assessment and reduction, including lipid modification”. In addition, the following two pathways, which compliment the AAC pathway, have also been updated to take account of NG238:

- Lipid optimisation pathway for secondary prevention in primary care / the community
- Lipid optimisation pathway following an acute or peripheral arterial disease event

The pathways have been published on the [HIN Network website](#). They were developed and updated by a group of clinical experts, in response to requests from clinicians for accessible pathways that capture current guidance and best practice.

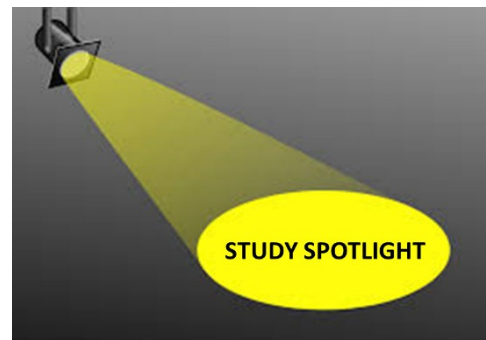

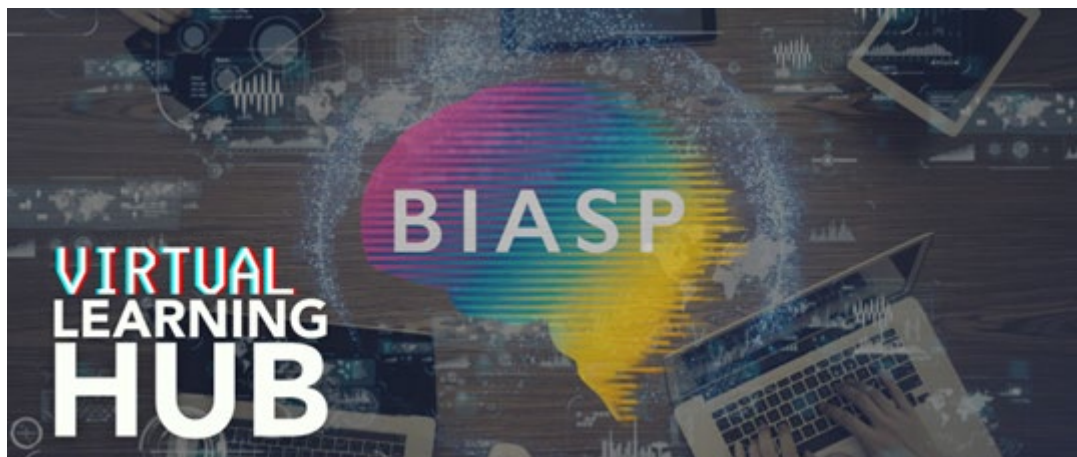

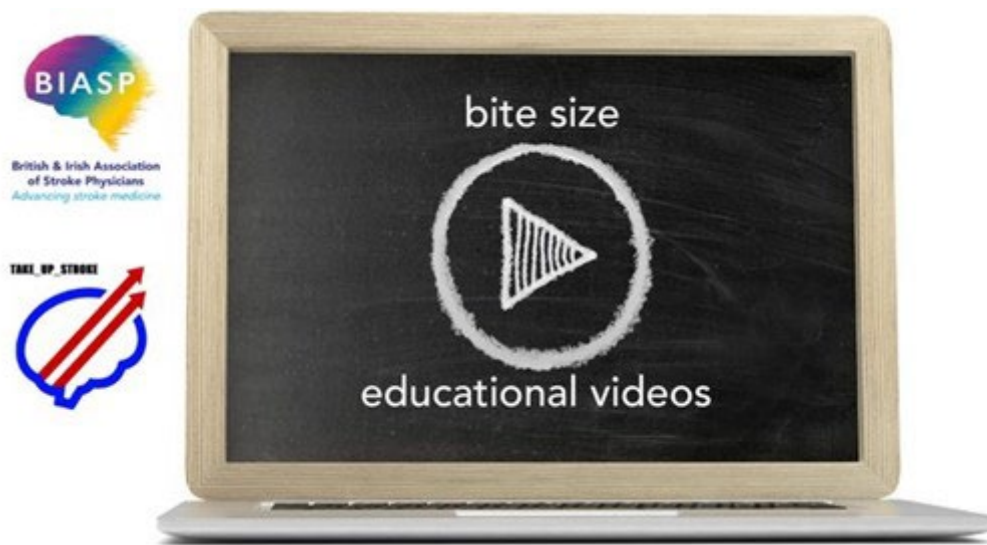
