Nevertheless, these are exciting times for BIASP; I want to highlight a few recent and ongoing projects led by BIASP on your behalf.

- The UK Stroke Forum (UKSF) in Liverpool was a huge success with a very high number of delegates. Informal feedback from BIASP members has been extremely positive, for which we must thank the Scientific Committee, chaired by Alastair Webb, for putting together such an excellent programme. The BIASP annual general meeting at UKSF was well attended with 115 attendees, with lively discussions; indeed, our total membership has grown to almost 900, which I hope shows that BIASP is now more relevant than ever for all the challenges we face in stroke medicine
- We launched our 2025-2028 BIASP strategy (you can read it [here](#)) and our executive team is working hard on monitoring and delivering this. One of our first actions is to seek accurate and comprehensive data about staffing levels in stroke services throughout the five nations in order to inform our workforce plan
- We recently launched new BIASP medical student summer bursaries (details [here](#) and application [here](#)). Please do promote and encourage applications for this excellent opportunity for medical students to get a taste of the exciting specialty of stroke medicine
- I'm also proud that, led by Bethan Davies, BIASP completed its very first carbon footprint in 2024 (read about it [here](#)), which will inform the sustainability of our activities in future
- Finally, the BIASP Trainees Meeting, a flagship event in our calendar, will be in Dublin Castle from March 6th to 7th 2025, I encourage you to promote this to all trainees within your teams

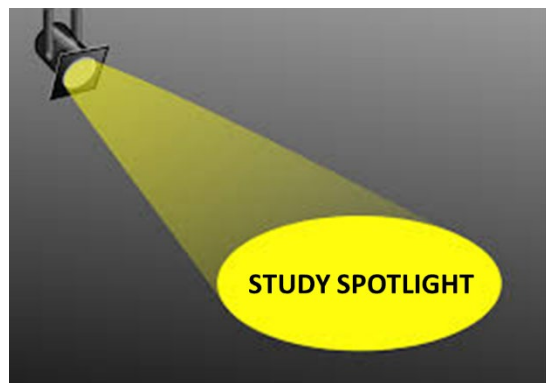

They discuss their career pathways, the benefits of a career in stroke, and opportunities for the future workforce.
