ID-Stroke: Think Aloud Interviews

The ID-Stroke study is exploring how healthcare professionals make decisions regarding the investigation of stroke aetiology, including what investigations to order, sequencing of these investigations, when to stop looking for a possible cause, and the factors that influence these decisions.

Role of Immunomodulation in thrombotic and microvascular primary antiphospholipid syndrome

Antiphospholipid syndrome (APS) is an autoimmune antibody-mediated prothrombotic disease causing stroke, and increasing evidence suggests that thrombo-inflammation plays a major role in the pathogenesis of thrombosis. However, anticoagulation, mainly with vitamin K antagonists (VKA), is currently the main treatment modality to prevent recurrent thrombosis. Despite treatment with VKA, patients with thrombotic APS may develop recurrent thrombosis.

New Research at the University of East Anglia - Suicide Assessment in Aphasia: a Delphi Study (SAADS)

Stroke survivors are at a significantly increased risk of attempting suicide. This risk is predicted to be higher within stroke survivors with aphasia, yet there is no clear guidance on how to detect/assess risk of suicide within this group.

This study is an opt-in Delphi Study.

problems, sleep, memory, sexual function and vision were all common. These responses are consistent with other studies that have reported the long-term needs of people after stroke, and demonstrates the importance of life after stroke as an area for service development and research.
